Dear Secretary Powell,

The National Congress of Vietnamese Americans (NCVA), a nonpartisan and nonprofit organization, advocates the civic participation of all Vietnamese Americans and Asian Pacific Americans. We commend you for your continued efforts of being a harbinger of peace. NCVA aims to improve living conditions and economic selfsufficiency of Asian Pacific Americans by heeding President Bush's call to volunteer and to participate more actively in all facets of our communities.

During this period of heightened security when American values of freedom, democracy and entrepreneurship are being attacked, Americans should speak with one voice. Unfortunately, the State Department's interference in the legislative process of Virginia's House Bill 2829 goes against the unified voice necessary against all powers foreign and domestic.

As an organization, we encourage active civic participation and involvement of Vietnamese Americans in the legislative process. This participation is a hallmark of what it means to be an American. As reported in the media, your letter to the Socialist Republic of Vietnam's Foreign Ministry assuring them that "HB 2829 will be killed" disturbs us. It disturbs us as American citizens when the State Department supports the opinion of a foreign regime that does not support American values nor is it a partner in the fight against terror and all those who harbor them.

The 1.2 million voting taxpayers have the right to exercise free speech and to support legislation that they find amiable. This is an example of democracy being exercised. Voters organize and elected officials respond to their constituents. We respectfully request that the State Department does not undermine our efforts of participating in local initiatives and being more active as the President of the United States has asked us to do in our continued efforts of building a better democratic America.
