

Did you know...?

- *The Census 2000 found that AAPI homeownership rates are significantly lower than the national average. While the national average for homeownership is 66.2 percent, the average for Asian Americans is 53.2 percent and even lower for Native Hawaiians and Other Pacific Islanders at 45.5 percent.*
- *A nationwide study conducted by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in 2001 and 2002 found that AAPI's face significant levels of discriminations when searching for housing in large metropolitan areas.*
